PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

To prepare leaders in the profession of physical therapy who are capable of conducting research that will improve the lives of people through whole person care, to serve as client/patient advocates, and to serve as educators in entry-level and graduate physical therapy programs.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

For almost three decades, graduates from our research orientated DSc (1995) and PhD (2015) programs have expanded the lives of students and patients around the world. Loma Linda University's strategic plan includes a powerful goal of "Anyone, Anytime, Anywhere" education which gave rise to our most recent program, the online PhD in Physical Therapy. This program adds extra flexibility for working physical therapists who are seeking a modern, evidence-based curriculum to serve the whole person.

Whether your goal is educating the next generation of therapists, expanding the current body of evidence-based practice knowledge or improving your skills as a clinician, this program will adapt to your busy schedule. On-line classes combine with routine mentoring to produce quality, cutting-edge research in a variety of laboratories, both on and off campus.

As part of the School of Allied Health Professions (SAHP), Department of Physical Therapy, the PhD program begins with a distinctive core of classes. These fundamental courses align with the American Physical Therapy Association's movement science agenda as well as with LLU's Mission, "To continue the healing ministry of Jesus Christ".

This curriculum is uniquely and individually designed to meet the student's interests, background and desired area of research. This is accomplished through collaboration with the program director and the dissertation chair who work carefully with the student to create an interesting, challenging and applicable direction of study that will facilitate acquisition of the skills needed to produce exceptional research. Because this is a research-oriented doctorate degree, the PhD student will then select a research guidance committee consisting of 3-4 content experts to facilitate student-driven, faculty-supported research that is published by the end of the program.

After completing the required number of units of didactic work and a comprehensive examination, PhD students will engage in the active research process utilizing the experience, skills and knowledge of their dissertation chair. These esteemed research mentors are recognized faculty of the LLU School of Allied Health & Faculty of Graduate Studies with a wide diversity of research interests and active research studies.

The PhD student's research will take place in one of several specialized laboratories including:

- 1. Orthoscience Research Laboratory
- 2. Neuroscience Research Laboratory
- 3. Motion Capture Research Laboratory
- 4. SAHP Clinical Molecular Research Laboratory
- 5. Off-site location with prior approval

Each student will be required to perform one or more research projects in partial fulfillment of the requirements for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Physical Therapy. The typical costs for student research projects range from \$2,500 to \$10,000. During the research project planning and feasibility processes, each PhD student will create a research budget in consultation with their dissertation chair. The physical therapy department will cover the first \$2,500 of approved research expenses. The student and/or their sponsor will be required to cover any research-related expenses over this amount. When necessary, the program director and dissertation chair will assist the student in attempting to secure funding for unmet research expenses.
