Additional prerequisite coursework, beyond the bachelor's degree, is not required prior to entering this program. Students admitted to the Transitional Master's program must show evidence of having completed a minimum of one undergraduate course in each of the following content areas prior to fall quarter of their second year in the program: biological sciences (such as biology, human anatomy, etc.), physical sciences (physics or chemistry required), statistics, and the social/behavioral sciences (such as psychology, sociology, educational psychology, etc.).</u>
