Notes:

- For students in the **PPDPT (prior Master's)** program, tuition rates for the 2017-2018 school year are **(\$633 per unit)**, tuition is calculated resulting in the costs above.
- In addition, University fees for the 2017-2018 school year are \$808 per quarter and include misc. on-campus fees.

- A personal desktop or laptop computer (or access to) with wireless capability and a broadband connection are required, and all students must have software compatible with the newest version of Microsoft Office. Additional recommended items such as a personal printer are not included in the estimate. Copy cards can be obtained to use on campus.
- An iPad **is** required for the program. Costs associated with their usage are not included in the above and are the student's financial responsibility. Students must be reachable by their programs through student email.
- For students to obtain financial aid to cover computer expenses, a form must be filed with the Financial Aid office. Please contact the Financial Aid office for more details.
- Housing and living costs are based on the living allowance provided by financial aid for off-campus students. Those students who live in an on-campus dorm or living with parents will be allotted less per month for housing. Please contact the Financial Aid office for more information.
- Personal living expenses are not included.
- Transportation costs to and from campus are not included and are the student's responsibility.
- Fees associated with background checks or finger-printing is not covered by financial aid and are the students responsibility.
- For financial aid purposes, the school year runs from summer through spring.
