



Certificate in Diagnostic Medical Sonography

Have You Considered a Career in Sonography

Sonography is a diagnostic medical procedure that uses high frequency sound waves (ultrasound) to produce dynamic visual images of many parts of the body, such as the abdomen, heart, and blood vessels.

Track 1: Medical Sonography & Vascular Technology

-- A 24-month program that prepares students for the Vascular Technology and Diagnostic General Sonography (abdomen, OB/Gyn) credentials.

Track 2: Cardiac Sonography -- A 12-month program that prepares students to receive a credential in adult Cardiac Sonography.

Certificate in Diagnostic Medical Sonography

Students completing the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program will receive a certificate and will join the ranks of distinguished alumni who have graduated from Loma Linda University's School of Allied Health Professions.

Academic & Clinical Schedule

Classroom sessions are held once or twice a week for 2 to 5 hours. Clinical training is 32-35 hours per week, Monday through Friday. The student is involved with classes and clinical education from approximately 7:30am to 4:30 p.m. or on a swing shift. The program includes rotations to multiple affiliate hospitals for additional clinical training.

Application Process and Deadlines

Applications are accepted from October 1 to February 1. All qualified applicants will be interviewed in April/May. Applicants must submit the career observation form, an essay, three references, transcripts from all schools attended, and online application by the postmark deadline of February 1, before an interview is granted. All pre-

requisites must be completed by mid-June of the Summer quarter prior to starting in September. All applicants accepted into the program will take the Fundamentals of Health Care class during the Summer quarter prior to beginning the program in September. Cardiac students will complete a EKG course during Summer quarter.

Academic Standing

Students must hold a minimum 2.5 average GPA in science prerequisites and a 2.5 overall GPA in prerequisites. Students must maintain at 2.5 GPA in the program.

School Session

A new class in Diagnostic Medical Sonography and Cardiac Sonography begins each September. We accept 12-14 students in the DMS program and 4-6 in the Cardiac Sonography program. There is no waiting list.

Previous Degree Requirements

The Loma Linda University Diagnostic Medical Sonography program offers two specialty tracks. For each track, students will need to have completed any one of the following:

- Any Associates degree (science area preferred)
- Any Bachelors degree (science area preferred)
- Be a graduate of an accredited Allied Health program, including nursing (2-year, LVN, registered nurse)

Prerequisites

In addition to the above, all applicants must complete the following prerequisite courses within the past *five years*:

- Anatomy and Physiology, two-part sequence with labs (AHCJ 250 and AHCJ 251 available at LLU as an evening class).
- Medical Terminology (AHCJ 311 - Medical Terminology, 2 units, available at LLU, or this prerequisite can be taken as an online class at another accredited junior college)
- Introduction to Physics
- College Algebra. Can have a higher level class, such as Calculus.
- Fundamentals of Health Care (taken before entering the program at LLU the Summer prior to starting the program.) Cardiac students will complete an EKG course during Summer quarter before program begins.
- Complete 8 hours of observation (volunteer/employee) in the LLUMC Sonography Department.
- Attend an information session during the LLU open house or other scheduled time.

CPR Requirement

Students are required to have a current Health Care Provider CPR card offered by the American Heart Association upon admission into the program. Students must maintain it for the entire length of the program.

Mental and Physical Abilities

Entrance and completion of this program signifies that the candidate is prepared to practice in the sonography profession. The candidate must be prepared to work in the standing position, do frequent walking, lift and transfer patients, communicate effectively, perform with both hands, and discriminate in color, depth, and dimensions. Also able to push and maneuver ultrasound equipment portably.

National Credential & Program Accreditation

Upon completion of any of the LLU Sonography certificate programs, you will be well prepared and eligible to take the national ARDMS (American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers) board examinations. This program has been fully accredited since 1983 by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Program.

Loma Linda University: Educating Radiology Professionals

Loma Linda University offers a number of programs in the medical imaging field. Besides Sonography, we offer programs in Medical Radiography, Computed Tomography, Imaging Informatics (online), Magnetic Resonance, Nuclear Medicine, Radiation Therapy, and Dosimetry. We also offer an online Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Radiation Sciences, a Bachelor's degree in Healthcare Administration, and an online Radiologist Assistant Master's degree program.

Financial Information
