Notes:

- Tuition for the 2015-2016 school year is \$718/unit. For students in the Special Imaging program, tuition is calculated according to a block system, resulting in the numbers above.
- University fees for the 2015-2016 school year are \$755/quarter and include misc on campus fees.
- A personal desktop or laptop computer (or access to) with wireless capability and a broadband connection are required, and all students must have software compatible with the newest version of Microsoft Office. The costs of these items are not included in the estimate. Additional recommended items such as a personal printer are not included in the estimate.
- A cellular device or personal digital assistant (PDA) or tablet is not required for the program but most students use them throughout various aspects of the program. Costs associated with their usage are not included in the above and are the student's financial responsibility. Students much be reachable by their programs through student email.

- Housing and living costs are based on the living allowance provided by financial aid for off-campus students. Those students who live in an on-campus dorm or living with parents will be allotted less per month for housing. Please contact the Financial Aid office for more information.
- Clothing expenses are not included. The dress code for the program may require students to wear scrubs
 or business casual clothing during both the preclinical and clinical years. Students often add these
 expenses to their personal budget before arriving on campus.
- Dues for national and local professional organizations are not included in the estimate. Student membership in each is optional, though membership is highly encouraged by the program.
- Dues for national and state licenses are not included in the estimate. Students must maintain licensure
 in both ARRT and CRT throughout the duration of the program. Students must also maintain current
 CPR certification throughout the duration of the program.
- Special Imaging does not currently qualify for Financial Aid.
