- For students in the **Master of Science in Radiation Sciences** program, tuition rates for the 2017-2018 school year are **(\$770 per unit)**; tuition is calculated resulting in the costs above.
- Any laboratory fees covers expenses incurred for clinical skills and diagnostics laboratories. The program does not charge students for use of the gross anatomy lab, simulation center or clinical skills center.
- A personal desktop or laptop computer (or access to) with wireless capability and a broadband connection are required, and all students must have software compatible with the newest version of Microsoft Office. Additional recommended items such as a personal printer are not included in the estimate.
- A cellular device or personal digital assistant (PDA) or tablet is not required for the program but
 most students use them throughout various aspects of the program. Costs associated with their
 usage are not included in the above and are the student's financial responsibility. Students much
 be reachable by their programs through student email.
- For students to obtain financial aid to cover computer expenses, a form must be filed with the Financial Aid office. Please contact the Financial Aid office for more details.
- Personal living expenses are not included.
- Transportation costs to and from campus and to clinical sites, and relocation or moving costs are not included and are the students responsibility.
- Fees associated with background checks or finger-printing is not covered by financial aid and are the students responsibility.
- For financial aid purposes, the school year runs from summer through spring. Thus, each student will apply for financial aid each year enrolled in the program.
- International students are subject to additional fees that will be applied to their tuition.
- All expenses, including tuition and fees, are subject to change.

Expenses after Graduation
