A Sonographer is a highly skilled professional who uses high frequency sound waves (ultrasound) to produce dynamic visual images of the human body. Students completing the Bachelor of Sciences with a major in Diagnostic Sonography will acquire highly valued skills in the various sonography specialties such as: Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics, Neurology, Breast, Vascular Structures, and Abdominal Structures.

Students completing the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program will receive a Bachelor of Science. and will join the ranks of distinguished alumni who have graduated from Loma Linda University's School of Allied Health Professions.

Program Design/Format

This 27 month program is 80% face to face coursework with about 20% online. The program is comprised of both classroom and clinical education. Students will spend 32-35 hours per week in a clinical setting Monday through Friday, with class held once week 2-5 hours. Class and clinical education is from approximately 7:30am to 4:30pm or on a swing shift (late afternoon to early evening). The program includes rotations to multiple affiliate hospitals for additional clinical training.

The program starts 12-14 students each June (Summer quarter).

How To Begin Application Process and Deadlines

Applications are accepted from June 1 to December 31. Priority deadline is October 15.

Application Requirements

- Previously completed courses that will complete the domain requirements of this bachelor's degree
- GPA of 2.5 or better (a higher GPA is more competitive)
- Current Basic Life Support with American Heart Association, adult and child
- Eight (8) hours of observation in Medical Sonography (preferably at LLUMC) is required prior to interview.
- Interview
- Any Associates degree (science area preferred) or hold an RT(R) license

Prerequisite requirements - applicants must complete the following subjects at an accredited college or university prior to entering the program:

*All students are required to take and pass the ARDMS SPI exam before completion of the program.

CPR Requirement

Students are required to have a current Health Care Provider CPR card offered by the American Heart Association upon admission into the program. Students must maintain it for the entire length of the program.

Mental and Physical Abilities

Entrance and completion of this program signifies that the candidate is prepared to practice in the sonography profession. The candidate must be prepared to work in the standing position, do frequent walking, lift and transfer patients, communicate effectively, perform with both hands, and discriminate in color, depth, and dimensions. Also able to push and maneuver ultrasound equipment portably.

National Credential & Program Accreditation

Upon completion of any of the LLU Sonography bachelor programs, you will be well prepared and eligible to take the national ARDMS (American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers) board examinations. This LLU program has been fully accredited since October 1985 by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Program.
