Costs for all expenses below are in accordance with current financial aid estimates for the 2017-18 school year. **Please note that all expenses including tuition and fees are subject to change and are estimated costs.**

Notes:

- Tuition for the **2017-2018** school year is \$800/unit. For students in the Special Imaging program, tuition is calculated per unit, resulting in the costs above.
- University fees for the 2016-2017 school year are **\$803 per quarter and** include misc on-campus fees.
- A personal desktop or laptop computer (or access to) with wireless capability and a broadband connection are **required**, and all students must have software compatible with the newest version of Microsoft Office. Additional recommended items such as a personal printer are not included in the estimate.
- **If a student does not have a laptop**, a PDA or tablet is **required** for the program. If a student has a laptop, a PDA or table is not required, but most students do use them throughout various aspects of the program. Costs associated with their usage are not included in the above and are the student's financial responsibility. Students must be reachable by their programs through student email.
- Housing costs are based on the average on-campus dorm fees and are subject to change.
- Personal expenses are not included. The dress code for the program may require students to wear **scrubs or business casual clothing**. Students often add these expenses to their personal budget before arriving on campus.

- Transportation costs to and from campus and to clinical sites, and relocation or moving costs **are not** included and are the students responsibility.
- Fees associated with background checks, drug screens, or finger-printing are the student's responsibility.
- Dues for national and local professional organizations are not included in the estimate. Student membership in each is **optional, though membership is highly encouraged by the program.**
- Dues for national and state licenses are not included in the estimate. **Students MUST maintain licensure in both ARRT and CRT throughout the duration of the program.** Students must also maintain current AHA CPR certification throughout the duration of the program.
- International students are subject to additional fees that will be applied to their tuition.
- Special Imaging does not currently qualify for Financial Aid.
