Have You Considered a Career in Healthcare Administration?

Healthcare administration is a broad-based discipline that serves individuals, communities, and entire populations in a variety of healthcare environments. Healthcare administration is an excellent career choice for the person who would like to have a profession in health care in one or more of the following areas: healthcare policy and strategy, marketing, communication, business continuity and sustainability, law and ethics, business and project management, human resources, health information systems, and organizational behavior.

Changing age demographics have created an increased demand for healthcare services, leading to a projected growth of 18 percent more jobs for medical and health service managers from 2018 to 2028. (Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor). This projected rate of growth is much faster than average, which means there will be more jobs available to you after graduation. Workers in the field of healthcare administration also have excellent earning potential - medical and health services managers earned a median annual salary of \$99,730 in 2018. (Bureau of Labor Statistics.)

The field further offers continuing opportunity for career and personal growth. Healthcare management requires ongoing education, and most employers encourage continued professional development. Many organizations provide tuition assistance or in-service training for new skills. Innovation and continuous learning will be a part of the job from day one.

Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Administration (BSHA) Online Program

The online BSHA program prepares individuals to serve in entry-level and mid-level healthcare administration in a variety of healthcare environments. Unlike many other programs in the marketplace, healthcare professional units can be applied to the overall units required for completion of the BSHA degree. For example, nursing, radiography, respiratory therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, dental hygiene, etc., units may be applied towards degree completion rather than a student having to take additional electives unrelated to student's career of choice. Thus, by enrolling in the BSHA program, students already employed in the healthcare industry may more easily earn a degree and pursue career advancement.

Degree Format

The BSHA program is an online program, allowing students to complete coursework on their own schedules. Students seeking to balance employment, family life, and higher education will find this format advantageous. While a limited number of videoconferences and teleconferences may be scheduled, there are always options for alternative asynchronous activities for students who cannot participate synchronously. The BSHA program begins summer quarter on an annual basis. Students may enroll full-time, and complete the program in 15 months, or part-time, and complete the program in 2 years. Classes are generally small, with an excellent faculty-student ratio.

Application Window - Applications are accepted between October 1 and August 1.

Admission Requirements

For regular admittance, applicants must have:

- A minimum of 96-quarter units (or 64-semester units), including program prerequisites (students who transfer from a community college may transfer a maximum of 105-quarter units, all other credits must come from a senior college)
- Minimum 2.5 cumulative college GPA
- High school diploma or GED
- Statement of purpose
- 3 letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts of all previous undergraduate work (sent by each institution previous to LLU)

Upon successful completion of the program prerequisites, co-requisites, the BSHA Core Curriculum, and elective coursework to satisfy at least 192 quarter units/128 semester units, the Bachelor of Science in Healthcare Administration degree will be awarded to students.
