Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission the applicant must have completed a Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university, and have a minimum GPA of 3.0 in both science and non-science courses, and complete the following prerequisites:

- Human Anatomy with lab
- Human Physiology with lab
- Intro or General Chemistry/lab (one course)
- Intro or General Physics/lab (one course) or Biomechanics
- Statistics
- Growth & Development or Abnormal Psychology

Note: Grades of C- and below are not transferable for credit. For pre-requisite courses, grades of B or better are expected.

Observation Hours

A minimum 80 hours of observational field experience under the supervision of an ABC certified clinician at an orthotic and prosthetic facility of the student's choice. Observation at more than one facility is encouraged. A letter of attestation from the facility owner or clinical supervisor is needed from each facility prior to the start of the program.

International Students

- TOEFL > 80
- WES evaluation: U.S. equivalency
- Proof of financial resources and LLU clearance
- Visa in hand before entry into U.S.

Upon Graduating

- NCOPE Required residency: 18-month OP combined or 12-month O and 12-month P
- Eligible to sit for American Board Cert. exam

Financial Aid - For U.S. students only

- Scholarships unavailable at this time
- Apply early for financial assistance - even before receiving your acceptance into the program.
