# PROGRAM OFFERED

• M.S.

The Department of Nutrition and Dietetics offers the following tracks that lead to a Master of Science degree. Graduates are eligible to take their registration exam after completion of their program track requirements.

- The BS+MS track includes five (5) quarters of graduate coursework after the completion of undergraduate courses. NOTE: The bachelor's and Master's degrees will be awarded after completion of the three-year program.
- The MS (prior BS/BA) track is for persons with a prior bachelor's degree. Applicants with a nutrition-related degree not accredited by ACEND must apply for this track.
- The MS (post-DPD) track is for persons who have completed an ACEND-accredited Didactic Program in Dietetics.

#### **EMPLOYMENT**

Registered Dietitian Nutritionists (RDNs) work in a variety of settings such as hospitals/healthcare facilities, private practice, community and public health settings, sports nutrition, corporate wellness programs, food industry, academic institutions, and research and development.

#### Compensation

RDN compensation varies by practice area according to data from the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics 2021 Compensation and Benefits Survey of the Dietetics Profession.

The following amounts are based on the 75th percentile of reported earnings.

- Entry-level (<1 year) \$82,000
- Acute Care/Inpatient \$73,000
- Outpatient Care \$79,000
- Food & Nutrition Management \$110,000
- Community/Corporate Wellness \$91,000
- Education (Assistant Professor) \$100,000
- Research \$77,000

# 1) Bachelor of Science plus Master of Science (BS+MS) Track

Entry occurs at the beginning of the third or junior year of college. To be eligible for admission, the applicant must have completed a minimum of 96 quarter/64 semester units at any accredited community college, college or university, and earned a minimum of 3.0 GPA in both science and non-science prerequisite courses. The minimum requirements are:

# 2) MS (with prior BS/BA) Track

# Prerequisites:

Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university College Algebra, or Pre-Calculus, or Calculus General Chemistry with Lab (one full year) Human Anatomy with Lab & Human Physiology with Lab Microbiology with Lab Human Nutrition

#### REQUIRED

Certificate of Completion or grade for a Medical Terminology course.

# 3) MS (post-Didactic Program in Dietetics) Track

#### Prerequisites:

Bachelor's degree from ACEND-accredited Didactic Program in Dietetics DPD Verification Statement College Algebra, or Pre-Calculus, or Calculus General Chemistry with Lab (one full year) Human Anatomy with Lab & Human Physiology with Lab Microbiology with Lab

# 3) MS (post-Didactic Program in Dietetics) Track Prereouisites:

Bachelor's degree from ACEND-accredited Didactic Program in Dietetics DPD Verification Statement College Algebra, or Pre-Calculus, or Calculus General Chemistry with Lab (one full year) Human Anatomy with Lab & Human Physiology with Lab Microbiology with Lab

# How to apply:

We recommend that you apply soon after September 1. The deadline to submit applications is January 31. The application process is completed via DICAS (the Dietetics Inclusive Centralized Application System). University catalogs may be viewed on our website. The outline of your plan for prerequisite completion must be indicated on the application. Prerequisite course work must be completed at an accredited community college, college, or university.

# FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS:

TOEFL or IELTS (or equivalent English language proficiency examination) scores are required for applicants whose native language is not English or whose secondary education was received outside the United States (refer to: <a href="https://alliedhealth.llu.edu/admissions/international-students">https://alliedhealth.llu.edu/admissions/international-students</a>)
