	Refer to and complete all actions on this checklist.	Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy – October 1 to February 15

	Explore our program information and FAQ on our website.	Thank you for reading through our complete program information on our website before contacting us with additional questions. Most questions you may have are answered online.
	Complete the Radiation Therapy Observation Requirement (24 hours)*	Complete observation at any Radiation Oncology Department <i>before</i> interviews. Aim for completing this by February, since interviews could be in March. Refer to the Radiation Therapy Observation Process document. NOTE: If you plan to complete observation at LLUMC, your application and transcripts MUST be in for you to schedule hours. If you plan to complete them elsewhere, contact Stacy Lemerond (slemerond@llu.edu) to confirm that it is an acceptable clinic
	OPTIONAL Attend the Radiation Therapy Session at the Annual LLU Open House.	Save the date- LLU Open House will be in January. Please RSVP at www.llu.edu prior to attending.
	Refer to and complete all Allied Health Admissions requirements.	See Admissions info at alliedhealth.llu.edu
	Apply online	This fee is currently waived
	Provide 3 references. You will be instructed to submit the email addresses of your references during the online application process.	Strong references from the applicant's prior work supervisors, instructors, or health care professionals knowledgeable about the applicant.

	Request Official Transcripts from all colleges and higher educational institutions you have attended. All transferring credits must be from an Accredited College or Institution.	Transcripts must be sent directly from the institution and may not be hand delivered or sent by applicant.
	Submit Essay (length not to exceed 1 page each)	Each applicant is required to submit an online application, and within the application are ethics-based questions, and a 300-500 word essay. The essay is to include the following: why you chose radiation therapy as a profession, why you have chosen to attend Loma Linda University, what you have done for service activity in your life, what your goals are in the next five years, and why you see yourself as a therapist.
	Complete required prerequisite courses outlined on second page.	By June for NON-ARRT, September for ARRT All required courses must be completed and must be from an accredited College or Institution.
	Interviews Conducted by invitation of the department	Typically conducted online from March to April
	Admissions decisions sent to applicants by SAHP admission office.	End of May
	Confirm your program acceptance by sending a nonrefundable deposit. (\$100)	June 1st
	Program begins	Non-ARRT: June, online ARRT: September

* Career Observation must be completed before the application interview. ** Interviews will only be granted when the application and all elements have been received by the postmarked deadline. All elements must be submitted for the application to be considered.
