MAJOR: Cardiac Electrophysiology Technology – AS

Electrophysiology is a subspecialty of cardiology that focuses on treating heart rhythm abnormalities. The Cardiac Electrophysiology Technologist will assist the Cardiologist during invasive procedures, including implantable cardioverter defibrillator (ICD) and cardiac resynchronization therapy device implantations.

We offer an Associate degree for this program, which is 12 months in length. The AS degree is face to face with some online coursework.

The clinical laboratory scientist supervises, evaluates, or performs laboratory tests that aid the physician in the diagnosis, monitoring, and treatment of disease. MAJOR: B.S. Degree - COMMUNICATION SCIENCES & DISORDERS

Speech-language pathologists are concerned with evaluating and treating children and adults with communication disorders. Difficulties in the areas of speech, language, fluency, and voice are associated with a variety of disorders, including developmental delay, hearing impairment, cleft palate, cerebral palsy, stroke, and head injury. Audiologists are concerned with prevention, identification, assessment, and rehabilitation of hearing disorders. For both professions, it is important that the student have an interest in working with people.

Employment opportunities for speech-language pathologists and audiologists exist within speech and hearing clinics, public schools, hospitals, universities, health departments, skilled nursing facilities, home health agencies, rehabilitations centers industry and private practice. These fields allow for considerable flexibility and there is ample opportunity for employment.

TRANSITIONAL MS - Admission to the program requires a bachelor's degree from an accredited college/university. Additional prerequisite coursework, beyond the bachelor's degree, is not required prior to entering this program. Students admitted to the Transitional Masters program must show evidence of having completed a minimum of one undergraduate course in each of the following areas prior to fall quarter of their second year in the program: biological sciences (such as biology, human anatomy, etc.), physical sciences (physics or chemistry preferred), statistics, and the social/behavioral sciences (such as psychology, sociology, educational psychology, etc.).

COMMUNICATION SCIENCES & DISORDERS MS - Admission to the program requires a bachelor's degree in Communication Disorders (also called Speech-Language Pathology). **Note: students admitted to the graduate program must show evidence of having completed a minimum of one undergraduate course in each of the following areas: biological sciences (such as biology, human anatomy, etc.), physical sciences (physics or chemistry preferred), statistics, and the social/behavioral sciences (such as psychology, sociology, educational psychology, etc.)

MAJOR: BS Degree - CYTOTECHNOLOGY

Cytotechnology is a specialty within the broad field of clinical laboratory science. Cytotechnologists aid in the early detection of disease by differentiating normal, atypical, and malignant cells. In recognizing microscopic abnormalities of cells and cellular patterns from the various body sites, the cytotechnologist assists the pathologist in detecting cancer at its earliest and potentially most curable stage. Upon successful completion of the program, the graduate is eligible for certification by the American Society for Clinical Pathology and for licensure by the State of California.

MAJOR: DIAGNOSTIC MEDICAL SONOGRAPHY, B.S.

A Sonographer is a highly skilled professional who uses high frequency sound waves (ultrasound) to produce dynamic visual images of the human body. Students completing this degree will acquire highly valued skills in the various sonography specialties such as: Obstetrics and Gynecology, Pediatrics, Neurology, Breast, Vascular Structures, and Abdominal Structures.

This 27-month program starts each June and is 80% face to face coursework and about 20% online. Students will spend 32-35 hours per week in a clinical setting.

MAJOR: B.S. Degree - EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE

The B.S. in Emergency Medical Care is a post-professional degree program designed for those with prior experience in Emergency Medical Services, Respiratory Therapy or Nursing. The degree is designed to expand the clinical knowledge of pre-hospital care providers and offer them an educational foundation from which to pursue leadership career roles in emergency services systems.

The 2-year upper division program in Emergency Medical Care allows the health professional to progress within his/her chosen profession to positions in clinical specialist, education and management. Students who wish to continue their education may also apply this degree, with additional coursework, to meet pre-physician assistant, pre-medical, or graduate school entry requirements.

This is a unique degree for pre-hospital and emergency medical care providers because of the program's emphasis on the physiological and clinical aspects of care of the patient in the emergency medical system.

To be eligible for the junior year of this program, the student must (a) be an EMT, EMT-paramedic, R.N., or respiratory therapist; (b) complete the subject requirements listed as prerequisites; (c) arrange for an interview.

MAJOR: HEALTH CARE ADMINISTRATION, B.S. (ONLINE)

Health care administration is a broad-based discipline that provides students with a unique opportunity to help improve the lives of individuals, communities, or entire populations. Health care executives have a deep sense of social mission and demonstrate compassion for the people they work with and serve.

The BSHA program leading to the Bachelor of Science degree contains a distinctive curriculum designed to prepare individuals to serve in mid-level administration supporting health care professionals such as clinicians, researchers and executives in a variety of health care environments. Such environments include assisted living and skilled nursing facilities; rehabilitation centers; private, public, and proprietary clinics; and medical centers. Students will be trained in health care leadership, emotional intelligence, sustainability, information systems, financial management, assessment, strategic and marketing plan development, personnel management, law and policy, and operations management. These core skill sets give students a competitive edge in the health care sector.

The BSHA program provides an online curriculum for students with full time employment and hectic schedules. Additionally, the program meets the needs of the adult professional that has already taken previous coursework to complete a Bachelor's degree or has earned an Associate's degree at another accredited college or university. Most program activities are asynchronous. A limited number of online synchronous activities via videoconference and teleconference methods are required throughout the program with options for alternative asynchronous activities for students who cannot participate synchronously. Students have the opportunity to visit the Loma Linda University (LLU) campus twice during the program, for orientation and upon graduation. The BSHA program commences annually summer quarter.

Health Information Administrators have opportunities to assist in the development and implementation of health information systems for quality patient care, financial reimbursement, medical research, healthcare planning, and healthcare quality evaluation. Others responsibilities include privacy, security, and data governance. Health Information Administration provides job flexibility for the person seeking work in a variety of settings. Many are employed by hospitals and medical centers, small community hospitals and other health care alternative delivery systems.
