

Entry Requirements for Respiratory Care: Post-professional Bachelor of Science Degree

Needed	Completed	Requirement
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Successful completion of a CAAHEP approved or provisionally approved advanced practitioner associate degree(or the equivalent) program in respiratory care.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Human anatomy and physiology with laboratory; or general biology with laboratory; or general zoology with laboratory; complete sequences.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introductory chemistry with laboratory, complete sequence or general chemistry with laboratory, complete sequence.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Microbiology with laboratory.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Physics-If applicant does not have high school level physics, one quarter or semester of introductory or general college-level physics is required.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • General psychology or sociology.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A course on cultural diversity.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1-4 quarter units (1-3 semester units) in the social sciences (anthropology, sociology, geography, etc.)
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 20 quarter units (13 semester units) in humanities and religion (art, music, philosophy, literature, history, foreign language, etc.)
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mathematics. Two-years of high-school level mathematics selected from: algebra I (elementary algebra), algebra II (intermediate), or geometry with a grade of C (2.0) or better (May be taken in high school or in college).
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Freshman English, complete sequence.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Introduction to computers
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Speech.
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two physical education activities or courses.

Loma Linda University will transfer up to a maximum of 50 quarter units to cover the respiratory care professional coursework, and up to a total of 105 quarter units (70 semester units) from accredited two-year colleges. All transferable course work from a four-year college or university is accepted at Loma Linda University. No coursework with a grade of C- or below will be accepted.
